


Bauline Municipal Habitat Conservation Agreement

The Town of Bauline and the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador signed a **Municipal Habitat Conservation Agreement in 2015**, with an expansion signed in 2025, committing to the conservation and enhancement of wildlife habitat within the town's planning boundaries.

The agreement designates the following as Conservation Areas, totaling 837 acres: Rocky Pond, Pouch Cove Gully, Bakeapple Marsh, Bauline Rocky Pond, Rogers Gullies, Rogers Tilt Pond/Church Pond/Little Gully/Cove Pond, and the Shoreline. The majority of areas conserved under the agreement are freshwater wetlands containing ideal feeding, nesting and staging habitat for numerous waterfowl species, songbirds, and other wildlife.
